Highlights from the Dec. 13th Council meeting:

Attendance: Church attendance had been on an upswing, but it has begun to dip again. There is some concern as the lower attendance isn't translating into boosted on-line viewership. *Everyone should be reminded of virtual options and call the office if they have any questions.*



Giving: It was noted that contributions have continued to decline.

COVID Guidelines: There was an extended conversation about the changing Covid situation, and if any changes should be made to worship. It was decided that, although our Bishop has recommended tighter entrance policies for all churches, we will continue to follow the guidance of the CDC as we don't want to alienate our members or visitors.

Music: The Chancel Choir is taking a break due to COVID concerns. We hope to have them back shortly after the new year.

Youth & Family: The December 5th event was well attended, and families seemed to enjoy reconnecting; plans are underway for additional events. Members of the Confirmation Class will be helping at the Easton Neighborhood Center on December 30th and 31st.

Property: Additional outdoor lighting has been added for safety. Ground fault outlets have been installed in the church kitchen and nursery school rooms. The outdoor Nativity and Narthex Christmas Tree were assembled.

Community Care: 195 bars of soap were collected for Ingathering (they had asked for at least 35). The food bins were removed from outside of Hope House due to potential for freezing.

Thank you: Diane Laustsen, Jon Bleice, Marge Drake, and **Sharon Wasmer** were thanked for their time on Council, particularly during such trying times when extra meetings were required. **Sue Himmelreich, Laurie Roth,** and **Ed Schaeffer** were thanked for joining Council in 2022.
