# FROM THE PASTOR

We live in interesting times, don't we? And to be sure, the pandemic is the main reason that things are "interesting" right now. There is a concern I have that I've been shying away from addressing something in a formal manner. Honestly, I have not wanted to hurt anyone's feelings, or to step on anyone's toes.

This has to do with the decisions around whether or not you get the vaccine. I know this is a sticky issue. To begin, I want to make it clear that if your doctor has said to you that you should not receive the vaccine then you should not receive the vaccine. I am not addressing a decision between you and your doctor.

I am more concerned when I hear "me" reasoning. This is my decision, no one should be making this decision for me. As Christians, our decisions cannot be about me, rather, they must be about how our decisions affect others.

Jesus set this tone for us by the way he lived his life. Never did we hear Jesus talk about what was good for him. For Jesus, the priority was always what was good for us. God put us first, and that empowers us to put other people first. We've been forgiven and given the gift of Eternal Life so that we can care for those around us with the same love that God first gave us.

When I hear "it's my body, my decision", what I don't hear is that God is a part of that decision. That scares me. The further we walk away from God, the more difficult our lives are because we are walking away from God's love.

Please, as you make your life decisions (including about COVID), do so from the perspective of how God first loved us. Remember that it's not about me, it's not about you, it is about how we show that next person we come in contact with how much God loves them.

For the season leading up to Lent, the Bible Study class requested to take a deeper journey through the bible passages that will be discussed during Lent. The texts that will be examined each week are:


January 26: Exodus 20:1-7 February 2: John 1:1-14

# Parish Nurses Know Your Risk for Heart Disease

Heart disease is still the number one cause of death in the US. Several conditions including lifestyle, age, and family history can increase your risk for heart disease. About half of all Americans have at least one of the three major risk factors for heart disease: high blood pressure, high cholesterol, and smoking.



Age and family history cannot be controlled, but you can control that following risk factors.

**High blood pressure** is a major risk factor for heart disease. Often called the "silent killer", high blood pressure can have no symptoms.

**Unhealthy blood cholesterol levels** can build up in the walls of arteries, leading to a narrowing of the arteries, and can decrease the blood flow to the heart, brain, kidneys, and other parts of your body.

**Diabetes** raises your risk of death from heart disease.

**Obesity** is linked to higher "bad" cholesterol and triglyceride levels and to lower "good" cholesterol, as well as leading to high blood pressure and diabetes.

How do we reduce these risks?

Eat a diet which is lower in saturated fats, trans fats and cholesterol, and reduce salt intake.

**Get more physical activity**. The American Heart Association recommends 30 minutes of exercise a day, at least 5 days/week.

**Limit alcohol** consumption. Women should not have more than one drink per day and men should have no more than two drinks per day.

**Stop smoking!** Smoking damages the heart and blood vessels, and can raise blood pressure.

February is National Heart Month. Let's commit to reducing the risks of heart disease for a longer,

- Council will continue meeting twice a month due to ongoing COVID concerns.
