#### **We Need Your Help to Continue Our Mission**

- 3. In addition to the rehearsals, we only ask that you promise us to sing at one or both of the Easter Sunday services on Sunday, April 17th, 2022.




#### **DELEGATES NEEDED for SYNOD ASSEMBLY**

# HIGHLIGHTS from the

# **February 14th Council Meeting:**

**COVID Update:** No changes to the 8:30am service. A motion was passed to no longer require masks for the fully vaccinated when entering the building for the 10:30am service. Pastor will continue to mask for communion. Pastor will return to the Narthex after all services.



Finance: The committee will meet Feb. 17 to discuss the upcoming audit.

**Treasurer:** January offerings were very low, less than half of what was needed for expenses.

**SAW Events:** SAW will make a decision on holding the Mother's Day Tea, and any changes regarding attendance, by the end of the month. There hasn't yet been a decision about whether or not to hold the Rummage Sale.

**Synod Assembly:** We are still looking for both a female and a male representative for the congregation.

**Music:** Choir rehearsals will resume February 16. Mark Jonkman has proposed replacing the aging acoustic piano in the worship space with a digital piano.

**Office/Resource Management:** Elizabeth will be off for extended medical leave. Janet Ward will assist with The Cross in Elizabeth's absence. An editing program for PDF documents will be purchased for the two office computers. The office is still investigating what has caused recent communication difficulties within our email system.

**Mutual Ministry:** The Synod document "Congregational Mutual Ministry Committee" has shown that St. Andrew's will need to work toward Synod compliance, as well as our Constitution, to reform this committee.

Youth and Family: Enrollment has begun at SANS for the upcoming school year.

**Property:** We continue to have a leak around the steeple. The depression in the grass was filled with 4 tons of dirt and will be monitored for additional shrinkage. If this is successful, the same method will be used on the macadam. Macadam is also deteriorating on the south side of the parking lot.

**Worship & Music:** Ash Wednesday service will be in-person and online at 7pm with masks required in person. The remaining Wednesday services during Lent will be online only. There is hope that Holy Week services will be held in person, depending upon Covid numbers at that time.

**Congregational Care:** Lay Eucharistic Visitors are working to best serve within Covid Guidelines. Meals are being prepared and delivered to a church member twice a week. Blood pressure screenings and coffee hours have been suspended temporarily.

**Community Care:** Easton Neighborhood Center is grateful for the continued donations of diapers, laundry detergent, & food.

**Spiritual Gifts:** Discussions have begun to revamp both the committee and the spiritual gifts database.
