HIGHLIGHTS from the May 9th Council Meeting:

Pastor Neel reported that Sunday worship attendance continues to climb.

A motion carried to move our three second year confirmation students to full adult membership May 29th, and to accept a new adult member, as well as an infant into membership by baptism in the coming weeks.

A motion was approved to combine Confirmation classes with St. Mark's Lutheran Church next year on a trial basis. Pastor Neel will teach the classes which will alternate between buildings, with students being confirmed into their own, home church.

Mark Jonkman reports that the Chancel Choir has concluded rehearsals for the church year. He anticipates bringing the youth choir back in the fall.

Motions were made and passed to hire Kristina O'Neill Davis as Director of St. Andrew's Nursery School (see announcement, page three) and Rocco Presto as Sexton (see page six).

An audit of our finances was completed on April 26th.

An outdoor service (weather permitting) was approved for Sunday, June 12 at 9:00am, as was a potluck brunch to follow in the church building.

Several of our teams suspend meetings for the summer. Those teams include Worship and Music, Property, and St. Andrew's Comforters.





Challenged by mental tasks	Make a mistake when bal- ancing a checkbook	Unable to complete tasks that may be familiar to you, such as balancing a checkbook or following a recipe
Difficulty completing activi- ties of daily living	Sometimes need assistance with an electronic device	Need assistance with brushing teeth, getting dressed or using a phone

Welcome to Our New Church Sexton


