Council Votes to Explore Becoming a Reconciling in Christ Congregation

At the June 12 Congregation Council Meeting, the Council approved moving forward with becoming a Reconciling in Christ congregation. First and foremost, that does not mean that a decision has been made, but that the congregation, in meeting, can make that decision. It does mean that we will be moving forward with information about what it means to be Reconciling in Christ.

Moving forward will mean that we will talk about the ways we can be supportive of the LGBTQIA+ community. We will have opportunity to talk about the six times that this topic is addressed in the bible (it is never addressed in the Gospels). We will talk about the possible difficulties and challenges that might arise because of our support of the LGBTQIA+ community. We will talk about whatever you want to talk about as it relates to this topic.

To be sure, you have been very welcoming and supportive and David and myself. I will never be able to fully express my appreciation for that support and acceptance, and it was because of that support that I felt we could enter into conversation about becoming a Reconciling in Christ congregation.

I have been in touch with the Synod task force who will be helping us with this process. All I ask is that you participate in the process and discussion, that you feel free to ask any and all questions that you have, and never be afraid that you will upset David or me for asking questions. This has to be an open and loving process, it is the only way that we can move forward as a congregation.

Highlights of the June 12th Council Meeting

We continue to offer postcards and addresses of our local, state, and federal representatives, and ask membership to consider reaching out to those representatives requesting common sense gun legislation.

Council approved the purchase a new website builder to begin the process of making a new, updated website.

Council decided to begin the process of becoming a Reconciling in Christ Congregation.

At the recent Synod Assembly, it was decided to acknowledge and honor the Indigenous Peoples who were forcibly removed from their homelands, and upon whose ancestral lands we gather. Synod also laid out financial safeguards that they expect all churches to be following (we are fully in compliance). In addition, there was a lengthy discussion about the model of one paster/one congregation being unviable today and in the future, due to a severe shortage of pastors and seminary students.

May offerings are again behind budget, a concern as we head in to summer.

St. Andrew's Women has been very busy with the recent rummage sale, luncheon, boat trip, and potluck.

Property: The roof was recently patched, near the kitchen entrance. Carpets will be cleaned the last week of June. New monitored smoke and CO detectors have been installed in the church building. Work continues on the spring clean-up. Dead trees have been removed, others trimmed.

Doors and windows in the church building have been re-numbered to coordinate with the space they enter in to. Floor plans with "You are Here" and fire exit paths are being produced for each room of the building.

The Nursery School Audit will be held on July 20th.

Outdoor Worship is scheduled for Sunday, August 27.

People are using our driveway to avoid the traffic light, speeding through, and there have been some dangerous near misses. We are looking at solutions that will permanently close off the Freemansburg entrance.


