## Bishop Shares Discouraging Forecast at 2023 Synod Assembly By Pastor Neel

One of the things that was made very clear at this year's Synod Assembly is that the church as we know it is headed for some changes. The statistics that were shared at the Assembly were upsetting. The one I've shared often is that out of approximately 250 congregations in the Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod, 70 of those churches are without a pastor. The fact is, the Bishop does not have 70 pastors to place in the vacant parishes. Not even close. There are only ten people in seminaries from our Synod at present, and that is an improvement.

It is because of these facts that the Bishop said that the concept of one pastor to one congregation is something that is fading away, as we are going to move to a situation where churches yoke together to share the services of a pastor.

This is not happening tomorrow, but the Bishop sees this as the most viable way for churches and congregations to find their way forward in the future.

Let me also say that all mainline denominations are experiencing the same trends. How each denomination handles their future will probably be different.

So, what can we do at St. Andrew's? Well, the short and easy answer is to grow. Like I said, no big changes are on our horizon for the near future. It is also logical to say that the bigger and more stable we are, the more attractive we will be for a future pastor. (No, this is not a hint that I am leaving soon). It is my guess that the bigger and more stable parishes will still be able to call a single pastor, while the smaller struggling parishes will be forced to do some type of merging or cooperative ministry.

Share the good news of God. Share how that good news is proclaimed at St. Andrew's. While I understand that the news I have shared can be discouraging, the message of Jesus is never discouraging.

We focus on Jesus, and that will see us through.
