### Flu season is here!

Hopefully, by the time you read this, you have had your flu shot. Flu season usually starts in October and ends in May, with the peak flu activity happening between December and March.

Here is a chart to help you distinguish flu symptoms vs. symptoms of the common cold:

Symptom	Cold	Flu
Symptom onset	Gradual	Abrupt
Fever	Rare	Common; lasts 3- 4 days
Aches	Slight	Common; often severe
Chills	Uncommon	Fairly common
Fatigue,	Sometimes	Usual
Sneezing	Common	Sometimes
Chest discom-	Mild to moderate;	Common; can be
fort; cough	hacking cough	severe
Stuffy nose	Common	Sometimes
Sore throat	Common	Sometimes
Headache	Rare	Common

How to treat early flu symptoms:

Get your rest Wash hands Stay hydrated Try over-the-counter medicines, such as Theraflu (check with doctor first)

People who are experiencing trouble breathing, chest pain or fever above 104 degrees should obtain medical attention immediately!

Dehydration in children can be very serious. You may see this when there is no urine in 8 hours, dry mouth or no tears when crying. Again, seek medical attention!
