Expenses: \$19,630.40 Offering: \$13,400.00 Short-Fall: \$ 6,230.40


Income from the Building Fund: \$ 8,500.00 Checking Account Balance: \$ 2,269.60



From Your Parish Nurses.....

It is Cold and Flu Season. How do you know if it is a cold, the flu, or COVID-19? Here are some tips to remember:

Cold symptoms are milder and set in gradually. Colds generally start with a scratchy throat, and then may include a runny nose, coughing, sneezing, sore throat, swollen glands, minor aches and pains, headache, low grade fever. Treatment includes staying hydrated, taking Ibuprofen or Acetaminophen, and rest. Symptoms may last for ten days.

Flu symptoms come on quickly and are more severe. Symptoms are a fever over 100 degrees, chest cough, weakness, extreme fatigue, headache, chills, vomiting, diarrhea, and full body aches. The Flu can last three to seven days and, if taken within 48 hours, Tamiflu can help reduce the symptoms.

COVID-19 usually starts with a fever over 100.4. Symptoms may include chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea. Treatment may include taking an anti-viral, but mild cases may be treated with Ibuprofen or Acetaminophen. The CDC says to isolatefor at least 5 days, or until fever and symptom free for 24 hours.

Contact your doctor if symptoms overlap with signs of Covid, if you are having trouble breathing or eating, a high fever, severe vomiting or diarrhea, a cough lasting over ten days, having trouble sleeping, or upper respiratory symptoms that last over a week. Remember to get your updated Flu and COVID vaccines, wash hands, and stay home when sick.
